Below are links to some useful web-based learning resources about the seafood industry.

## Australia-wide

- The <u>Fisheries Research and Development Corporation</u> website contains information about fishing in Australia.
- Fact sheets about Australian seafood are available on the Australian Seafood website.
- <u>PrimeZone</u> is a website designed as a 'one-stop shop' for primary industries resources. The site is currently expanding and will be searchable by the Australian Curriculum when finalised.
- The <u>Seafood Cooperative Research Centre</u> website includes some useful resources, including for schools
- Information about fish, and how to keep and care for them, can be found at <u>Fish</u> School.
- The <u>Australian Fisheries Management Authority</u> on-line game, 'The great Australian fisheries challenge' is a good introduction to the complexities and decision making processes of fisheries resource management.
- The <u>Centre of Excellence for Science</u>, <u>Seafood and Health</u> at Curtin University has developed this website about seafood nutrition especially for children. It includes information and a game.
- These <u>SeaWeek</u> resources are from New Zealand, but the questions for classroom discussion and activities are also relevant for Australian commercial fisheries education.

## Tasmania

- The Tasmanian Redmap web site is a fantastic resource for learning about the Tasmanian marine environment and has a Teacher Resource section. The 'Resources' page contains information about commercial fishing in Tasmania as well as the Tasmanian marine environment.
- The <u>Tasmanian Seafood Industry Council</u> has information about current issues in Tasmanian fisheries on their website.
- The <u>Tasmanian Dept of Primary Industries</u>, <u>Parks</u>, <u>Water and Environment</u> provide information about fishing and the marine environment on their website, including **Fish Fact Sheets**.
- The <u>Woodbridge Marine Discovery Centre</u> lists a number of teacher resources on its website. There are three downloadable units: *Fishing for the Future* (most relevant to SIPS teachers), *Tasmanian Marine Biodiversity* and *Humans and the Sea*.

• <u>Fishcare Tasmania</u> offer educational visits and talks for your class. Fishcare focus on recreational fishing, but may complement your SIPS partnership or marine unit.

## New South Wales

- <u>Fish n Kids</u> is a resource especially for children, developed by the NSW Department of Primary Industries
