### **NSW Trawl Fisheries Code of Practice**

### **Regulatory actions**

- 1. Be familiar with and comply with relevant fisheries legislation, closures and marine protected areas.
- 2. Be aware of any changes made to the legislation governing trawl fisheries.
- 3. Ensure that true and accurate records of fishing and catch effort are maintained and submitted in accordance with the legislation.
- 4. Use gear in accordance with the legislation.
- Only take permitted species of fish.
- 6. Comply with all species size limits as set out in the regulations.
- 7. Ensure only lawful implements are used to sort catches.
- 8. Produce fishing business card or digital authority upon the request of a fisheries officer.
- 9. Comply with any by-laws or regulations of relevant authorities.

#### Food quality and seafood sales

- 10. Ensure that all fish landed for sale are marketed in an authorised manner.
- 11. Comply with the requirements of the NSW Food Authority regarding the handling, icing, storage and transport of catches, to maximise quality and minimise food safety hazards.
- 12. Operate according to a prescribed Food Safety Plan that minimises food safety hazards associated with the harvest of seafood for human consumption.

#### **Code review and implementation**

- 13. Be familiar with the actions listed in the Code and implement where possible.
- 14. Assist with ongoing reviews of the Code, discuss amongst industry and stakeholders, and be proactive to increase community awareness of the stewardship actions listed in the Code.

### **TEP and bycatch interaction minimisation**

- 15. Be familiar with the list of and methods of identifying protected and threatened species, populations and ecological communities that might be encountered during fishing operations.
- 16. Conduct fishing operations in areas, at times, and in a manner that minimises the potential for interaction with protected or threatened species or ecological communities.
- 17. Ensure any captured individual of a threatened or protected species are returned to the water as quickly as possible and with the least possible harm.
- 18. Ensure catch and effort reporting is completed and submitted for any interactions with threatened or protected species.
- 19. Conduct fishing operations in areas, at times, and in a manner that minimises bycatch.
- 20. Use equipment or methods to ensure the least possible harm to any non-retained catches returned to the water.

### **Environmental stewardship actions**

- 21. Conduct fishing operations and maintain fishing vessels in a manner that minimises environmental impacts.
- 22. All litter and derelict fishing gear generated or collected during fishing operations is responsibly stowed onboard and disposed of using onshore facilities.
- 23. Inform the relevant authority of any significant pollution incident or environmental impact.
- 24. Appropriate spill containment materials should be stored onboard and used where required.

#### Personal and public safety

25. Ensure fishing operations are conducted in a safe manner for fishers and the public, including sufficient insurance cover.

#### Personal and public safety continued

- 26. Ensure fishing operations are conducted with an acceptable level of safety, according to details set out in the vessel Safety Management System.
- 27. Be courteous and co-operate fairly with any public official or member of the community.
- 28. Respect the public amenity of boat ramps by avoiding cleaning fish and gear in their vicinity and ensuring that access for other users is not unduly restricted.
- 29. Be proactive and assist maritime search and rescue operations where appropriate.

#### **Indigenous awareness**

30. Be aware of and respect the customs of the Aboriginal people.

#### Fisheries research, development and extension programs

31. Be pro-active, cooperate and assist fisheries related research, development and extension programs.

### **Personal development**

- 32. Maintain records of personal training and education competencies.
- 33. Be proactive and participate in programs that help to develop training and skills where appropriate.

#### **Community awareness and perception**

- 34. Ensure that actions of the vessel master and crew do not bring the industry into disrepute.
- 35. Engage in activities designed to improve community awareness of the NSW professional fishing industry commitment to responsible and sustainable fishing practices.
